

Jackendoff, Ray. 1975. Morphological and semantic regularities in the lexicon. *Language* 51. 639-671.

The paper provides a theory of the lexicon that would accommodate Chomsky's theory of the syntax of nominalizations. This required a formalization of the notion 'separate but related lexical entries'. The formalization developed uses redundancy rules for the evaluation of the lexical entries. The concept of lexical rules that emerges from the present theory is that they are separated into morphological and semantic redundancy rules. There are different morphological redundancy rules for regular verbs and for irregular ones (*buy-bought*), the pair *go-went* is counted as two independent entries.
